In 2012 our ministry in the medical clinics has given over 5800 consultations and 6 people were blessed beyond what they could believe with operations that they otherwise could not afford. One man told us that if not for God sending us to help him he would surely be dead now and we tell him it's God working through us. It's very important that we begin each clinic day by praying (**pictured right**) with the patients and while they wait their turn to see the doctor, we do education with them. All our work is so that God is glorified and we believe that is happening here.
