Faithful partners are a must and a blessing for us that are working overseas full-time on the mission field. Clearview Community Church has been one of those faithful partners since 2009. Not only does their church pray for us and support us financially but they bring wonderful mission teams every year. This year was no different as a team of 16 wonderful volunteers **(pictured below left)** came to partner with us once again from March 5 – 12! They brought us much needed supplies for the medical clinic, a real blessing for our patients. They continued to fund and work on Pastora's Mamota's house. This year they worked on tiling the floor **(pictured below right)**, sanding and painting the house inside and out, preparing the septic, digging trenches for the plumbing, mixing cement and touch up painting on the church. A special time of day would be lunchtime on the jobsite where our translator Rey would lead us in singing and praising our Lord. **(pictured bottom center)** Almost every day after working for 7 hours in the heat they would then do a Children's program **(pictured below center)** where over 400 children heard the gospel, sang Christian songs together, were entertained with a drama that taught them about God and learned about each missionary team member through cardboard

testimonies! After, the team fed the children a snack and juice and each child received a child's bible of their own! A highlight was hearing some of the children say "look Mommy I have my very own bible!"

The team also attended church services where Clayton Culham preached two great sermons and team members shared their powerful testimonies. They prayed for people **(pictured bottom left)** and were prayed for. There was also time to play with children **(pictured bottom right)** and even had a small baseball game. On their last day in La Vigia the team walked around the village with Pastora Mamota praying for families and distributing Bibles! Awesome work! Then we dedicated and prayed over the Pastora's home. What a great and fast week we had together.

Wait! That's not all. On the team's last day here in the Dominican Republic they went to the beach and 4 team members were baptized in Sosua beach! Yay! Praise God!

We want to say a big huge thank you not only for this year but for all the years that Clearview has been praying for us and supporting and partnering with us here in the Dominican to serve God and the poor! Clearview is truly a mission minded church!



More Mission Teams

March 16 – 23 brought us another team of volunteers! This group was a little different though ~ four women filled with the Holy Spirit and fluent in Spanish. These four women used their talents for the Lord ~ Yolanda, a worship leader, Lorna, a prayer warrior, Nena, a nurse and Eloisa, a Pastor. They came to minister to women and help us in the Paradise clinic. Mission accomplished! They hosted several Women’s ministries in several villages throughout the week. Many were blessed and we even saw some accept Jesus as Lord! Yay! They ministered to women at a pregnancy resource center in Puerto Plata bringing worship and the Word of God to over 25 women. Each woman received a Bible and gift bag. They were so thankful and blessed asking “when will they return?” In La Vigia they led worship and preached at the service there on Sunday evening as well as helped finish painting Pastora Mamota’s house. At the Paradise clinic they helped call patients, worked in the pharmacy, helped the nurses, organized donations and the best thing is they prayed for our patients while they waited. Many tears were being shed and burdens were lifted! Also, they did a sex education and purity talk in the clinic which was very educational for many women. These four wonderful women of God stayed with us in our home and cooked Puerto Rican and Mexican food for us. It was delicious and a blessing. Laughter and joy filled our home during this wonderful week. We want to say a huge thank you to Yolanda Cintron, Eloisa Otero, Lorna Gonzalez and Nena Ontiveros for blessing us and the people of the Dominican Republic. We hope and pray they come back soon!
